It was pretty much all business at our meetings last month as we prepared for the days leading up to our British Motoring Festival. The Baton Rouge meeting March 12th at Cafe' American was a full house, and the group worked to put together all the goodie bags for the show, filling them with donated items, and donating many items themselves. The guys worked out the logistics for the Valve Cover Races and made sure everything was in order

In Harahan on March 19th area coordinator Andrew Doran took a turn to run the meeting using our new projector and a PowerPoint presentation. He went over our website and Facebook pages, and the group also viewed a few vintage car videos. Chris Landry spoke on how to register your car for an antique plate and how to get a period correct license plate, I.e. 1958,1962, etc. The group discussed the car show events for Friday and Saturday, and reviewed the map, directions and the meeting place to caravan.

March 20th in Mandeville, after dinner and car talk at Coscino's, Benny, Colin and Cliff used the rest of the meeting to review the show layout, where all the different classes of cars were going to park, and how we were going to fit so many cars and get them all in there in time and in order. We knew then there were 135 cars registered and more expected, so there was a bit of anxiety about how that tall task would work. It helped a great deal that Dean Duplantier used his professional skills to draw a detailed map of the parking areas. All the assignments of our volunteers were reviewed and we did our best to explain how things would happen. This was the first year our Northshore group pretty much ran the show, but the group does have members who have worked on many of our car shows in the past. Even with the first time jitters, everyone still felt like it would be an awesome car show...

4th ANNUAL CAR DAY REPORT



The Sebring Experience

Mention Sebring to a road racer and they will know of the history, fame and the hard racing that has taken place over the last seven decades.

I attended my first 12 Hours of Sebring as a college freshman in 1962. A college friend lived close to the track and invited me to come with him. Gary Robertson, no kin, but we became lifelong friends. During that 1962 race, I got to see my hero Phil Hill race with Oliver Gendobien in a Ferrari 250 SWB against Graham Hill, Roger Penske in a Cooper Maserati, and other famous drivers of that era. The other cars were TR-4, Sunbeam Alpine, AC Bristol, MGA, and a Briggs Cunningham Jag. A three-hour race on Friday featured Steve McQueen in a factory Sprite, Sterling Moss, and Denise McGluggage, yes, a woman, who helped start <u>Competition Press & Autoweek</u>, which I read for years. She wrote an article for Fuller Brush Magazine featuring Phil Hill and his Ferrari. That article opened my eyes to the existence of Sports Cars, thus changing my life.




Sebring and racing sports cars was the idea of Alec Ulmann, who made his fortune making landing gear for WW2 bombers. Which is apropos as the Sebring Airport was the training base for the flight crews of B-17's and B-24's.

The first race was six hours and won by a Crosley Hot Shot. Alec and his organization ran the 12 Hours Race from 1952 to 1972, when IMSA took over.

I attended the 1964 race and saw the Carroll Shelby Cobras dominate the race. I then returned in 1971 as a member of Alec's crew, working in the food tent for the workers. I saw the Porsche 917's race against the Ferrari 512's. Two MGB's did not finish due to a head gasket and out of place connecting rod.

More Racing with Robbie

It was at the 1971 Sebring race that I took a picture of Mario Andretti racing a prototype Ferrari 312. I entered the photo in the <u>Road & Track</u> photo contest and got an Honorable Mention for it.

The next year, 1972 I was a Pit Marshall for NART, North American Racing Team's Ferrari Daytona driven by Sam Posey and Tony Adamowicz (Nickname Tony "A to Z). They finished in 13th place. Sam was the last driver of the day and we got concerned when he did not return with the other cars after the checkered flag. He finally arrived



saying that he took his time as this was the last race under Ale Ulmann's leadership, and he wanted to reminisce about all the great drivers and cars that had preceded him.

My first race on the short SCCA course was August 19-20, 1978, where I finished second in F-Production and in the rain on slick tyres. In my logbook I noted "Fun." I liked rain racing. The next day, Sunday I did not finish due to electric problems, "Lucas" does it again!

I returned the next year, June 1979, winning the Saturday race. I noted in my logbook, "Cakewalk," Sunday was not as good as I blew the right rear brake cylinder, while leading. I could see the puff of smoke out of the rearview Wink Mirror and my foot go to the floor. Because the car started out as an early AH Sprite, now a 1973 MG Midget, it had a single master cylinder containing the brake and clutch. Thus, I lost the clutch also. I quickly geared down by revving the engine to match the gears (Strong crosscut gears) to slow down. I dodged the C-46 and Martin airplanes and got turned around to rejoin the race. I was able to get back to second place. However, how do I stop the car in the pits? I did not have a handbrake, as the previous owner had removed it. Well, I slowed down with

the gearbox and turned the steering wheel really hard so that the slick tyres rubbed against the fenders. I then installed a double master cylinder system and added a hand brake. "Live and Learn!"

This adventure came back to me after our recent British Car Festival in Covington as my 1959 Morris Minor lost it's brakes driving home to Slidell. Fortunately, I took the back roads to cut down the stoplights and traffic. Also, the Minor has a mechanical clutch, so I used a combination of gear ing down and using the handbrake I had just tightened. The braking system was leaking at the right front brake caliper, an upgrade for this car.

My last race at Sebring, September 27-28, 1980 did not go well at all, as my MG Midget and I caught fire. I got nerfed by another car and spun out. As I was waiting for the corner worker to signal me back onto the racecourse, I smelled gasoline. Just then flames erupted and engulfed us in flames, starting on my left leg. I hit the kill switch, released my five-point harness, and turned to my fire bottle with my right hand releasing it from it's holder and climbed out of the car on the passenger side.

I was still on fire, so I thought, "I have 10 seconds with the drivers suit and 10 seconds with the Nomex underwear, Plenty of time!" I pulled the pin and set off the Purple K extinguisher aimed at myself and then the car. A corner worker helped put the fire out. I found that the gas filter had broken, and the electric fuel pump pumped gasoline all over the engine compartment until the gas hit the exhaust.



I stood there and waited for the race to end. I then realized that I had not and was not afraid. I had thought ahead as to where to mount the fire bottle, and in what direction so I could reach it quickly, and had shoes, gloves and suit that would give me time if a fire occurred. "Be Prepared" and I was never a Boy Scout. On the way home I stopped in a town that had a car wash and washed the residue from the fire bottle off the car so as not to concern Marian.

The experiences and adventures of racing my Austin Healey Sprite turned MG Midget to update safety and performance helped me in my Marketing Career, which was technical in nature.

It needed a new steering box, high-tension wire going into the coil and convertible top repair.
