




September 20th Drive to Natchez for Brits on the Bluff by Danny Varnado

For our Friday, September 20th drive to the English Motoring Club of Mississippi's Brits on the Bluff, we are planning to meet other adventurous parties at the B-Kwik Food Mart on Highway 33 in Gloster, Mississippi at or around 10:15 a.m. Then we'll depart the B-Quik at 10:30 and continue north on Highway 33 to Highway 61, then north to "The Old Country Store" and restaurant in Lorman, Mississippi. The plan is to arrive there between 11:30 and 11:45. In order to stay close to our schedule, the drive from Gloster to the Old Country Store will be at the posted speed limit.





After lunch, we'll take a 20 minute drive to the Windsor Ruins for a look around and photo opp. From the Ruins, we'll head south, pick up the Natchez Trace and head to the Emerald Mound, the second-largest Mississippian Period ceremonial mound in the United States. The last time that I visited the Emerald Mound (many years ago), the one mile road from the Trace to the mound was rather rough. If the road is still bad, those not wanting to venture down it can continue south on the Natchez Trace an additional 13 miles to the Natchez Grand Hotel.



Many of you may already know this, but I didn't know. Most screws on British cars are Pozidriv, not Phillips. I ordered a Pozidriv screw driver and it definitely works better on the car!

Some general info...

Pozidriv (PZ) and Phillips (PH) screws are both cross-shaped, but have some key differences:

Cross pattern: Phillips screws have a simple cross pattern with straight slots that meet in the center of the screw head. Pozidriv screws have a similar cross pattern, but with an additional smaller cross at a 45-degree angle to the main cross.





Grip: Pozidriv screws have smaller indentations at the corners of the main cross, which are designed to provide better grip and prevent the screwdriver from slipping out.

Torque capacity: Pozidriv screws have a higher torque capacity than Phillips screws, making them better for heavy-duty applications. Pozidriv screws are also less likely to slip or "cam-out" when higher torque is applied.

Screwdriver type: Phillips screws require a specific Phillips screwdriver to prevent damage to the screw head. Pozidriv screws can be installed with either Pozidriv or Phillips screwdrivers. But you should use a Pozidriv screwdriver on Pozidriv screws, because with high torque applied, the Philips screwdriver will damage Pozidriv screws,

Origin: Phillips screws were introduced in 1936–37. Pozidriv screws were patented by GKN Screws and Fasteners in 1962 after the patent for the Phillips head expired, but have been used much longer than that in an effort to address the issue of cam-out. Pozidriv screws are more commonly used in Europe, while Phillips screws are more popular in the U.S.






