E.E. Reynolds Memorial Rallye

Next Saturday, November 16th 10 a.m.



Our annual Memorial Rallye will be held next Saturday, and we hope you are planning to participate. Please let me know if you are coming so we will have enough material for everyone. This club event began in 1978, shortly after the beginning of the club, and has been done most years, sometimes just called the Memorial Rallye, and a few times not done at all for various unknown reasons. The name E.E. Reynolds Memorial Rallye honors the founder of the Louisiana Centre of the MG Car Club, which later became British Motoring Club New Orleans. Here's an excerpt from an April 1987 Morris Gazette Newsletter article on the history of our club:

In November of 1978 the founder of the club, Eldridge Reynolds, died in an automobile wreck in North Louisiana. We decided at that time to begin a Memorial Rallye in his honor, a tradition we November.

I posted a description and photos of last year's Memorial Rallye on Facebook and received this reply from Bill Weeks, who some of you may know, and who I believe now lives in Florida::

I was a member of the Louisiana club back then. As a matter of fact, I still have my pewter plate as winner of the first Elridge Reynolds Memorial Rallye.



So, in honor of Eldridge, and in honor of all club members past and present, we rallye!! Our drive this year will begin at the Tangipahoa Convention and Visitors Bureau on Wardline Road in Hammond, right off Interstate 55, Exit 32, and down the road from Southeastern Louisiana University.

From there, you'll be given directions on where to drive and what to look for. Each driver should have a navigator to help with directions and to identify and record the signs and landmarks along the way. It will help to have a clipboard and an extra pen or two. Each team will be given points for correct log entries, and points for the best time. We'll do a staggered start beginning shortly after 10 a.m. The drive is 60 miles and will take about 90 minutes, depending on the skill level of your team. The rallye will end at a popular gathering destination not too far from where we'll begin, and where we'll determine this year's winner. Lunch and drinks will be available for purchase. British Motoring enjoyment is sure to be had!





These rules were developed from reviewing accidents from other parades across the United States that resulted in a serious injury or fatality. Fortunately, the Harahan Police Department Christmas Parade has not had any serious injuries or fatalities in the past, and we would like to keep that record going, with your help and cooperation.



- The physical handout/distribution of candy by parade participants is ALLOWED and ENCOURAGED. All candy must be in original wrappers.
- NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES MAY BE CONSUMED PRIOR TO OR DURING YOUR PARTICPATION IN PARADE ACTIVITIES.
- Motor vehicles may not break traction at any time and not exceed the pace of the walking groups.
- Handouts (candy or materials) should be safe/properly placed on floats to avoid any injuries. It is the responsibility of the float owner to ensure proper placement of throws.
- The Harahan Police Department Committee must be notified at least 48 hours before the parade, of any changes.
- All participants must be prepared prior to their arrival at staging area.


