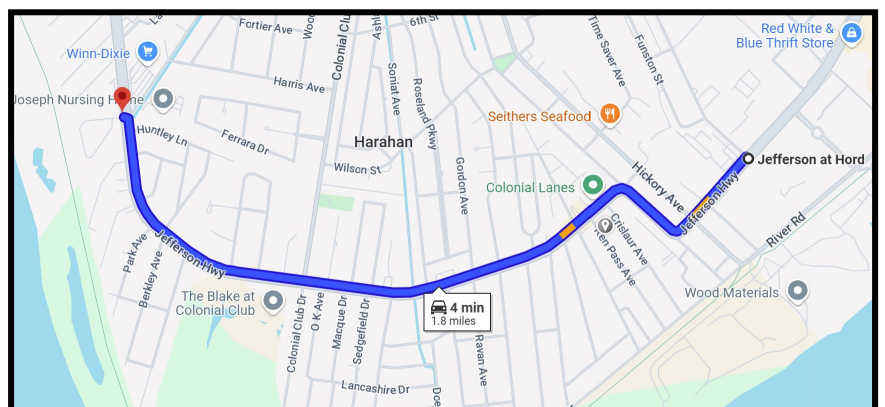
The Baton Rouge group will depart the Shell Station at I-12/Juban Road at 9:30 a.m., head down 1026 to 16 to Port Vincent, jump across the Amite River onto 431/931/431 to 61 (Airline Highway), and stay on Airline to Kenner, then on Jefferson Highway to Harahan to line up on the corner of Jefferson Highway and Hord St. Should get there a few minutes after 11, plenty of time to be ready for the parade at 12. Then the club Christmas Party is at the Harahan Senior Center from 2 to 5.

For Baton Rouge folks who will just be going to the Christmas Party, same meeting point, we'll depart at 12:15 and take the same route to Harahan straight to the Senior Center at 100 Elodie St.

The Northshore group will leave from Acquistapace's Wine and Cheese (the old Winn Dixie parking lot) at 10 a.m., drive across the Causeway Bridge and then all the way down Causeway Boulevard to River Road, right on River Road down to Powerline, then right to Jefferson Highway and another right puts us at the parade line-up site.

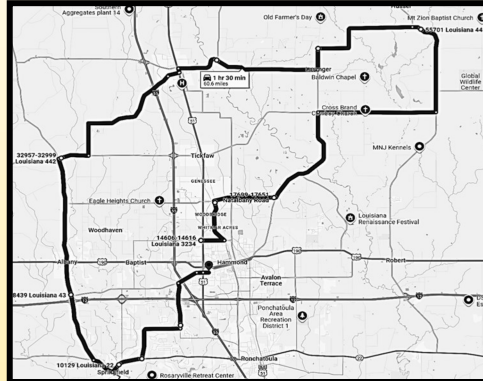




E.E. Reynolds Memorial Rallye November 16th

Photo 2) Turkey too expensive this year? Here's a cost saving and tasty option for your next Thanksgiving meal. Yum!

Photo 3) If you use microfiber rags for your Armor All, Windex, Rain-X, etc. and rewash them - take a picture of the color coding so that each rag goes back to its same chemical.



Photo 4) If you are short on space for your nuts and bolts you can screw the lid to a jar under a shelf or workbench. Note: use plastic jars NOT glass as pictured. For the obvious reason.

Baton Rouge C & C November 23rd

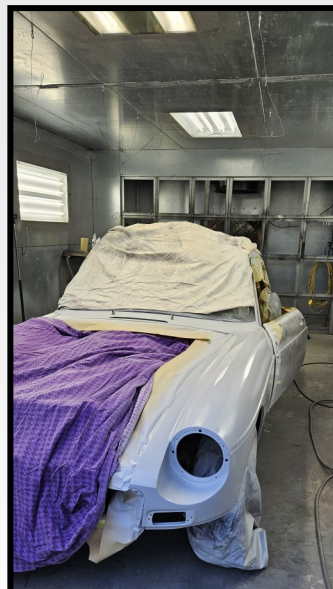

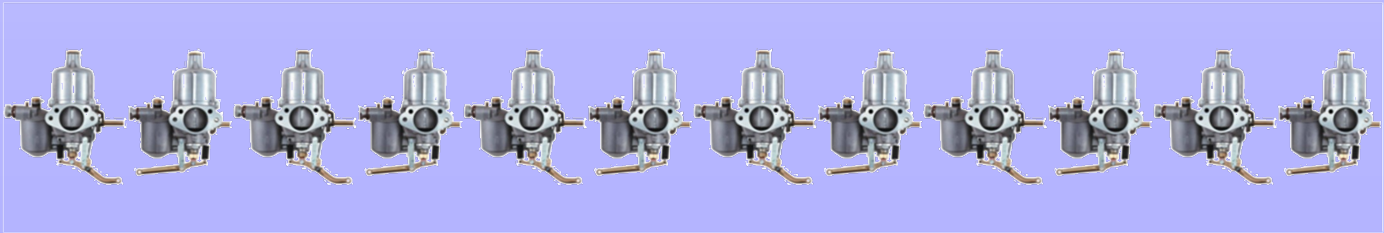

- NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES MAY BE CONSUMED PRIOR TO OR DURING YOUR PARTICIPATION IN PARADE ACTIVITIES.
- Motor vehicles may not break traction at any time and not exceed the pace of the walking groups.
- Handouts (candy or materials) should be safe/properly placed on floats to avoid any injuries. It is the responsibility of the float owner to ensure proper placement of throws.
- The Harahan Police Department Committee must be notified at least 48 hours before the parade, of any changes.
- All participants must be prepared prior to their arrival at staging area.

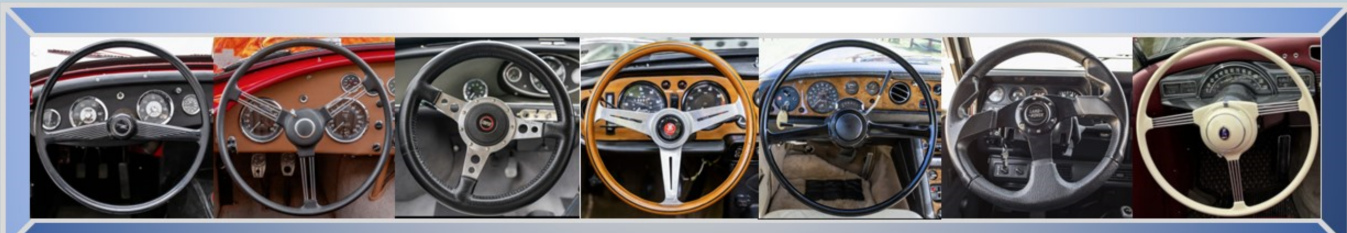

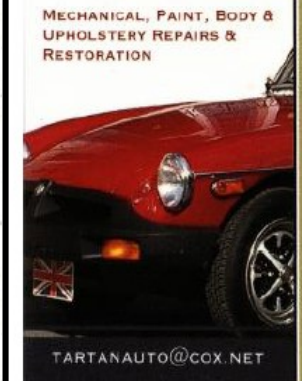

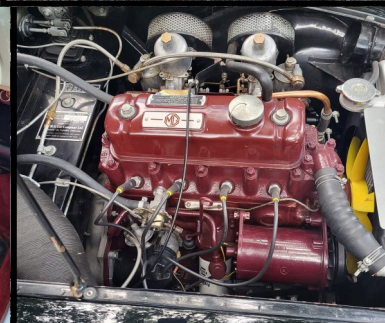
