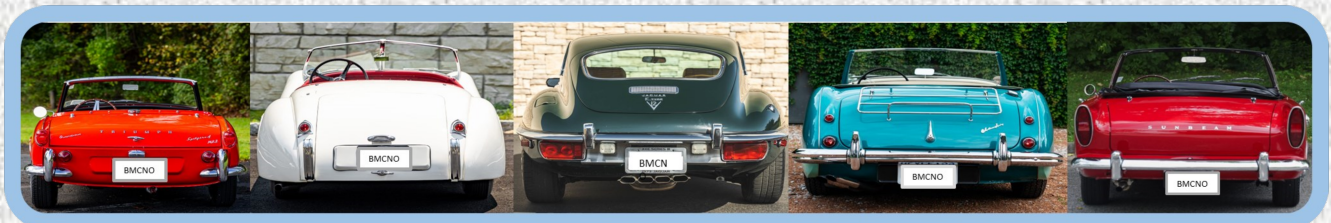

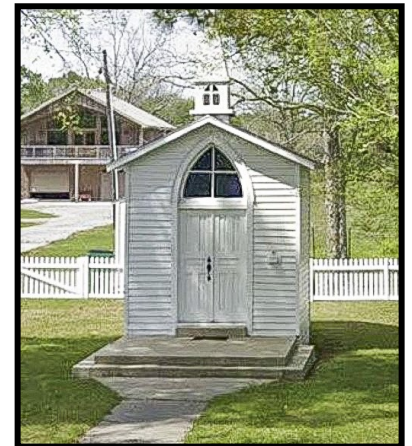
10:30 – 11:25 - Drive south on LA1 to McCall, LA, and catch River Road heading north.

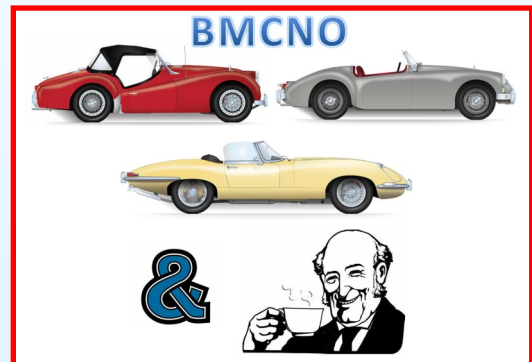
