



# Happy is Back on the Road by Robbie Robertson

First, why do I call my 1959 Morris Minor 1000 "Happy?" It started when I saw Happy's picture on the Facebook Marketplace site. It just looked happy and made me happy.

I purchased Happy to drive while I continued to rebuild my other British cars. I drove Happy a few times and entered it in our British Motoring Festival in Covington last year. When I started home, the brakes went out. I was able to downshift and use the handbrake to get home. This technique was not new to me, as I finished a race in my MG Midget without brakes. I found that my Morris Minor had been converted to front disc brakes and the right front caliper was leaking because of brake pad wear. This was an easy fix, as the brake piston was not damaged.



During a drive after breakfast at Liz's, all of sudden there was a mechanical sound, like something snapped. I thought it was inside the gearbox, but the clutch started to slip. I managed to drive back to Covington where Karl Keiger volunteered to trailer Happy back home for me.


Happy's drive train was disassembled and a new clutch assembly was purchased. I checked out the inside of the transmission and found it in good condition. I have another smooth cased gearbox, but it was not needed. When I compared the new clutch assembly parts to the old ones, I found that the old pressure plate was anodized blue, which was used in the older Morris Minor 850 flathead engines. The springs were weaker, and it was 1 centimeter shorter in height than the new pressure plate. See the photo and see the level favoring the new pressure plate.

While Happy was elevated on jack stands, I installed a front sway bar, which has enhanced Happy's drivability. I also cleaned up the rest of the drivetrain. While I had the axles out of the differential, I noticed that the brake shoe springs were different between the left and right side, so I replaced them with the proper ones. See the picture and the difference. The straight spring is the proper one.

Dan McGovern and Joel Rutter helped me reinstall the drivetrain, and upon starting Happy and driving again, I found a great difference in the clutch operation. Lesson learned — do not trust that the previous owners used the proper parts.

While everything was apart, I purchased new proper sized tyres and painted the rims a darker green. I also added a radio that has Bluetooth for me to have handsfree phone conversations while shifting. You cannot see the radio as it is behind the glovebox on the passenger side of the dashboard. A remote control allows me to change the source of music.







So Happy and Robbie are back on the road, and we are both Happy again! There are a few more improvements to be made, but now we can travel around the area and have fun while I get back to the MGs that need attention.


# British Motoring Club New Orleans Valve Cover Raceway

If you haven't yet, start working on your valve cover racer so you can participate in the fun at our British Motoring Festival. You can be just about as creative as you want. The rules are very simple.

### **BMCNO Race Rules**

### The Valve Cover Race Cars:

- No engines or propulsion.
- No moving weights.



- Nothing can extend beyond the front of the valve cover.
- Cars shall be based on an actual rocker cover from a British <u>automobile</u> engine.
- Cars must have four wheels, each no more than six inches in diameter.
- Wheel must have a non-metallic surface contacting the track.

### **Critical Dimensions:**

- 15-inch maximum overall car width.
- 10-inch maximum overall car height.
- 10 pounds maximum weight by official scales.
- The front of the car should have a contact point approximately 2 ½" high.

### **Track Dimensions**

### The Course:

- The course shall consist of a launch incline ten feet long, followed by a level run of sixteen feet
   all plywood surfaces.
- The launch incline shall be divided into two lanes, each 18 inches wide. The incline shall be about three feet high at the rearmost part.
- The official "Starting Line" is two feet from the rear edge of the incline. Rear wheels must fit within this measurement!

### **Running the Race**

# The Races:


- Double elimination brackets in heats of two cars each. (Each pair will race in each lane 2 out of 3 if a tie)
- NOTE: The starting gate is 3.5 inches tall. Racers should have a surface flush with the front of their car approximately 2 ½ to 3" high to contact this metal tab.
- Individual starting via push buttons by each racer, following an electronic "Christmas Tree" lighting system.
- The finish line shall be marked sixteen feet from the front edge of the launch incline.


